Skipping Through Michigan Our First Rally

At the completion of the WBCCI International Rally at Escanaba, Michigan, we attended a short caravan traveling along the East side of Lake Michigan with seventeen Airstream trailers. This was a short caravan that lasted only eight days but was perfect for a first timer. Here are some of the highlights of our trip.

Saturday, July 29th we met thirty Airstream friends at Bay Mills Resort and Casino RV Campground in Brimley, Michigan. Yes, we gambled, and no, we did not win anything. Sunday, we visited the Soo Locks in Sault St. Marie, Michigan. We cruised through the locks, traveling twenty-one feet straight up in our boat, and along the waterfronts of Lake Michigan and Canada. We went over and under the International Highway Bridge with a view to remember.

On Monday, we all left for the Great Lakes Shipwreck Museum at Whitefish Point Light House Station. There we visited the oldest operating Light Tower on Lake Superior and saw the bell of the Edmund Fitzgerald. On Tuesday, we left Bay Mills and traveled to the campground at St. Ignace, Michigan preparing for a full day on Wednesday at Mackinac Island. We toured the island in a horse-drawn carriage, visited Fort Mackinac, and had lunch at the Grand Hotel.

Thursday we set off to Holland, Michigan; the longest leg of the caravan at 275 miles, arriving in time to visit the President Gerald Ford Museum. Friday was the tour of a 1761 Dutch Windmill and Gardens. Here we learned how to make wooden shoes (if you need any see Jim). Saturday we all said our goodbyes and started home. Seymour is now in the driveway at home getting re-supplied for our next trip on August 30th to Mesa Verde. To be continued...

**Pow Wow Rally by Iowa Unit
In Tama, IA at Meskwaki Casino RV Park**

The Pow Wow rally was August 10th - 13th in Tama, Iowa, hosted by the Iowa Unit. Attending from our Nebraska Unit was Scott and Kathy Allen; Gary and Cheryl Burrows; and Larry and

Marcia Link. The rally was held at the Meskwaki Casino RV Park, west of Tama. Hosts were Norm and Linda Beu; Mike and Linda Ricker, and Mike Donahue (he will be President of Iowa Unit next year). On Thursday, we toured the Weiting Theater, a 100+year old opera house in Toledo, Iowa. With over \$1 million dollars in wonderful renovations, the theater is beautiful with replicas of the original ceiling and wall murals, seats, original oak flooring, and fabulous original stage curtain. In over 100 years, the building has always been used for stage shows, classes for actors, and as a movie theater. They have also had wedding/anniversary celebrations there over the years and plan to add an addition once funds are raised for the second phase of the renovation. All people working there are volunteers, so all proceeds go into the second phase future project, which is an addition for community events, etc.

Our second tour was of the Midwest Sleep Mattress Factory which is also in Toledo. Here they make both foam and spring mattresses and can turn out over 600 mattresses a day. They make stock mattresses as well as "made-to-order". Turn around is within two to three days from order until shipment. If you are in need of a mattress, go to their website at: www.midwest-mattress.com where there is a list of dealers. The factory was very impressive; wood framing pieces for box springs come from outside Amish personnel and then built in factory. They sew all their own mattress covers. Cloth/foam material arrives in rolls and converted to mattresses; springs are made outside the factory.

On Friday/Saturday, we observed the 103rd Annual Meskwaki Pow Wow put on by the Sac and Fox Indians from various states. They wore their native costumes and head gear and performed ceremonial dances within every age group. This Pow Wow originated from the traditional



religious and social beliefs of the Meskwaki Tribe, but it is currently more of a social event. Tents surrounded the ceremonial grounds with Indian merchandise, and food and drinks available for

purchase. The land where the Pow Wow took place was the original land purchased by the Meskwaki, not a reservation.
